Sustainability Requirement

In order for courses to meet this requirement

Antioch College is adopting the following criteria, derived from the AASHE ([Association for Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education](#)) curricular sustainability standards. A sustainability tagged course must address sustainability as an integrated concept including one or more social, economic, and environmental dimensions.

Sustainability challenges

Consistent with [Transforming Our World: The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development](#) (United Nations, 2015), major sustainability challenges include (but are not limited to) climate change, global poverty and inequality, natural resource depletion, and environmental degradation. To identify courses that contribute towards understanding or solving sustainability challenges, it is helpful to ask:

- Does the course contribute towards realizing one or more of the principles outlined in [the Earth Charter](#)? *And/or*
- Does the course contribute towards achieving one or more of the targets embedded in the [United Nations Sustainable Development Goals](#) (SDGs)?

Criteria for courses that meet the Sustainability Requirement:

A course may *either focus on sustainability, or contain a sufficient amount of sustainability-related material*, to qualify as a course that meets the sustainability-tagged course requirement at Antioch College. For the purposes of meeting this requirement, sustainability-related course learning outcomes must be explicitly highlighted as such in the syllabus, and should focus on understanding or solving one or more major sustainability challenges.

While a foundational course such as chemistry or psychology might provide knowledge that is useful to practitioners of sustainability, it would not be considered a sustainability course, unless the course learning outcomes explicitly describe the sustainability outcomes. Likewise, although specific tools or practices such as GIS (Geographical Information Systems) or Oral History can be applied towards sustainability, such courses would not count as sustainability courses unless their primary and explicit focus is on sustainable applications. If there is a sustainability unit, module or activity within one of these courses, but it is not the main focus, the course may be counted as a “course that includes sustainability”:

Sustainability-focused courses

For the purposes of meeting the Sustainability Requirement, a “sustainability-focused course” is one in which the *primary and explicit focus* of the course learning outcomes is on sustainability and/or on understanding or solving one or more major sustainability challenges. This sustainability-related content must be documented in course descriptions and syllabi (including, but not limited to, the schedule of course activities). This does not necessarily have to be reflected in the course title. Examples include courses in which the *primary and explicit focus* is on:

- Sustainability as an integrated concept having social, economic, and environmental dimensions:
 - Introduction to Environmental Science, Sustainable Development, Sustainability Science, etc.
- The application of sustainability within a field:
 - Sustainable Agriculture, Architecture for Sustainability, Sustainable Business, etc.
- Providing skills and/or knowledge directly connected to understanding or solving one or more major sustainability challenges, *within a framework of sustainability*
 - Climate Change Science, Renewable Energy Policy, Environmental Justice, Green Chemistry, etc.

Sustainability-containing courses

For the purposes of meeting the Sustainability Requirement, a “sustainability-containing course” is one in which at least 10% of the content has its *primary and explicit focus* on sustainability; the course as a whole does not need to be primarily focused on sustainability or a related topic. This sustainability-related content must be documented in course descriptions and syllabi (including, but not limited to, the schedule of course activities).

- The minimum time spent on sustainability must be equivalent to one full week of teaching activities in a 10-week quarter, but need not be all within the same week/section;
- It is recommended that courses that include “applied/hands-on” sessions such as lab or studio time devote at least one complete lab/studio session explicitly to sustainability and/or its applications; this session need not be within the same week(s) as the “lecture” portion of the class;
- Examples include courses that:
 - Incorporate a unit or module on sustainability or a sustainability challenge
 - Include one or more sustainability-focused activities
 - Integrate sustainability issues throughout the course
